The police & detectives are trained to never make any assumption before they have carefully observed all the facts presented to them. It would be wrong to start with any assumption? In the same way believers must first start with the discipline of observation of Scripture **before** making any application to life. God forbid that we would overlook this important standard operating procedure as we study God's Word. Now with each category below there are key scriptures that have to do with a person's salvation. 1st observe carefully the scripture then write 3 observations from that passage alone, 2nd only then make one application that would be true in a line with the observations you've made. You are always free, if not encouraged, to observe the context of the passage listed as well.

The Cross: Grace, Justified, Forgiven

(Remember 3 observations then 1 application)

1. Eph. 2:8-9
2. Romans 4:23 – 5:2
3. Col. 2:13-15



The Butterfly: Reconciled & New Creation

(Remember 3 observations then 1 application)

1. II Cor. 5:14-21



The Tombstone: Eternal Life & Assurance

(Remember 3 observations then 1 application)

1. John 6:27, 39-40, 44, 47, 51, 54, 58, 68
2. I John 5:10-13
